

## LAKE TEXCOCO ECOLOGICAL PARK

The goal of this project is to reclaim the site as the most important green piece of infrastructure of the valley, reconciling the city with its geography, incorporating the hydrological cycles, eliminating the threat of floods for the metropolitan area, and finally contributing to re-establish the native biota. The design team set up a series of intervention strategies including

reforestation, re-vegetation and reintroduction of species, all of which are meant to bring back a recovered ecosystem to the city.

Historically, the ancient Texcoco Lake basin has been contaminated for over thirty years. The site is recently obtained with a large area over 143 million square meters. Located at the outskirts of the metropolitan zone of Mexico City, the site is proposed to be transformed into a ecological site embracing nature culture and infrastructure: a Cultural Ecology.






2) Seasonal Landscape; Border transition


