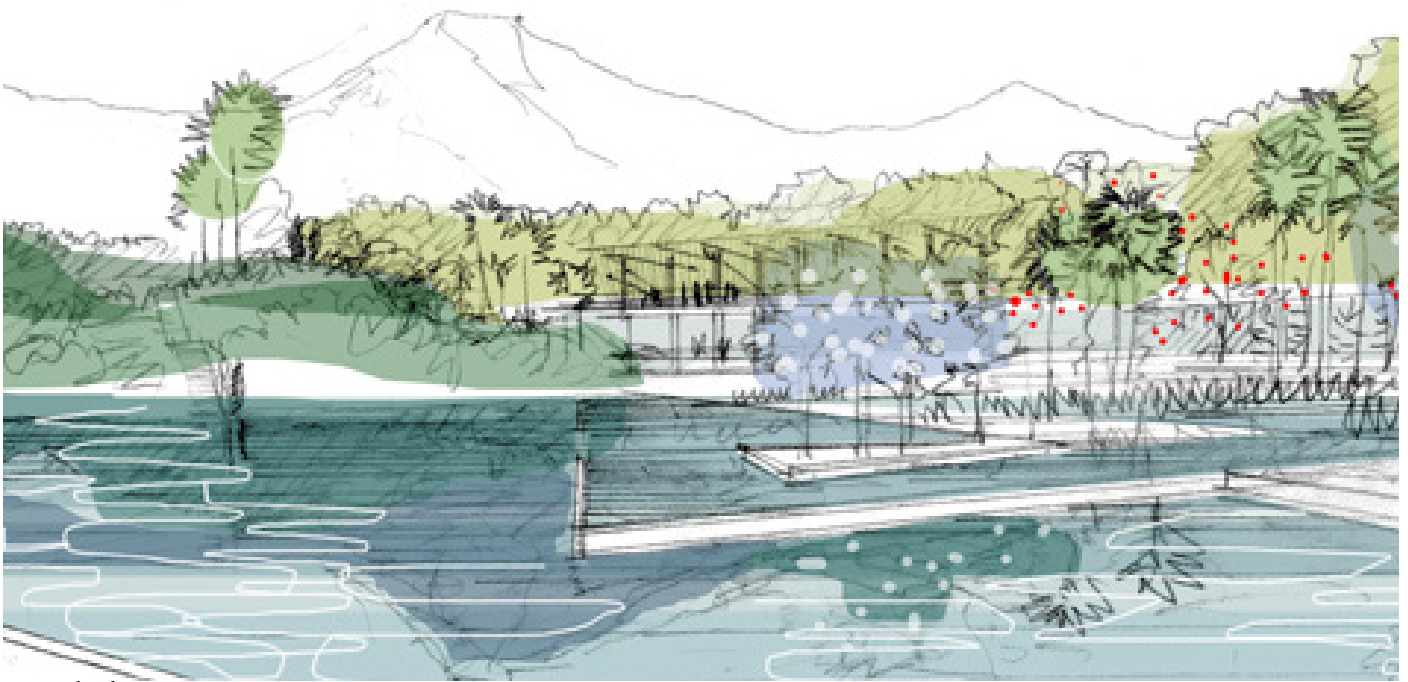

This project is located in Santiago de Chile. It is the result of a public contest that was based on establishing a strategy for a landscape and urban development at the preexisting park Las Americas.

The construction of the project started in 2006, and was developed in two phases. The park is defined by three areas; The Paseo de los Platanos, la Explanada Central, and el Talud.

The Bicentennial Park project was a contest created by the Vitacura Municipality. They were looking to establish an strategic plan that would be able to organize the

development of the terrain that is located at the border of the Mapocho River.

The terrain is part of a series of green areas that extend all over the border of the river, from the west and the center of the city. It is the complex of green areas more extensive in Santiago de Chile, in which four parks stand: The Los Reyes Park, the Forestal, the Providence Park, and the Bicentennial Park.

The situation of the park is identified as an area of communal use that will provide many public areas as Vitacura, Providencia, Huechuraba, and Las Condes. The Bicentennial park is looking to provide to the urban fabric of Vitacura an improvement in the public space in the east area.

The principal point of the Park will be provided to the families spaces for gathering, walks, contemplation, and entertainment. It will provide activity to a diverse type of neighbors.
